



Packaging Guidelines



1. Quick Guide



Choose the right packaging

Choosing the right/suitable packaging depends on the material and size of the item(s) to be shipped. (Recommended to include minimum 5cm space for cushioning materials for each dimension; length, height, and width)



For **soft, non-fragile goods**, you may use flyers.



For **goods (fragile or non-fragile)** and **fragile goods**, standard shipping boxes are recommended.

Please consider the **extra space** required when shipping **fragile items** as the best packing method would be **box-in-box** (Refer to **page 4** for more info)



Heavy items are best to be packed with double-walled boxes



Wrap your products

It is recommended to individually wrap the item(s) with at least 3 layers of bubble wrap before packing it into the shipping box.
 The bubble wrap should cover all sides of the item(s).

For **fragile items**, please pack them with the **box-in-box** method.




Pack to fit snugly

- It is important to minimise empty space in the box. This is to prevent items from shifting about throughout the delivery process.
- Cushion the empty space with peanut foams, air cushion, air pillow, bubble wrap, styrofoam, etc.



Seal the box securely

- Tape your boxes with the "H-taping method". It is best to use 4.8cm wide cellophane tape to secure the seal.
- Use labels to ensure appropriate handling, transport, and storage.

3. Measuring Items and Boxes



- · Take into consideration the bubble wrap and cushioning that will secure your goods from damages.
- It is recommended to include a minimum 5cm for each dimension of your goods for cushioning. Ensure that the cushioning is placed on all six sides, especially for fragile goods.
- · Recycled Boxes must not have U.N. or DG labels.
- All standard sizes of boxes are available for purchase on the GDEX website under Packaging Solutions.

Packing Methods for General Items

a) Packing with Flyers

Recommended for **documents**. Goods made out of fabric or soft plastic can be packed into flyers for delivery as well.

Our flyers come in three sizes:

- Mini (250mm x 180mm)
- Small (420mm x 300mm)
- Big (500mm x 435mm)



b) Packing with Boxes

It is recommended that non-fragile goods are individually wrapped with bubble wrap and placed into a box filled with cushioning materials.

Tape the box using the **H-taping method** on the top and bottom of the boxes.





c) Packing Box-in-Box



- We recommend for fragile goods to be individually wrapped with bubble wrap, and placed into a box filled with peanut foam. Then, place the box into a bigger box with peanut foam. It is best to secure the boxes with H-method taping.
- Fragile goods that are already in its original packaging can be packed box-in-box. Then, wrap the whole box with bubble wrap before placing it into the bigger box.

d) Packing Box-in-Flyer




- We recommend for electronic goods to be individually wrapped with inflatable air column, and placed into a mailer box or packing box. If the size of the items are small, mailer boxes can also be used. The box will then be inserted into flyers.
- If your electronic goods are in its **packaging**, it can be **placed into flyers** according to **size** and **weight**.
- Ensure the boxes are **securely** packed/sealed.



Wrap the device with air column


Pack the item inside a box. Ensure there is adequate space.




Wrap the box with flyer and attach the consignment note


Seal the box tightly with "H-taping method"

e) Packing Odd-Sized Items



- Odd-sized items such as furniture that is heavy and very large needs be wrapped to withstand lifting and transportation.
- The furniture must be **individually wrapped** on ALL SIDES with **stretch film**.
- The furniture must not exceed the dimensions of **300cm** length x **240cm** height x **200cm** width.






Ensure the item's length is<300cm, height is<240cm and width is<200cm



Wrap all sides of the furniture with cling wrap



- For items that are thin, flimsy, and very long such as fishing rods, please disassemble them first.
- The long, thin parts should be packed inside a pipe/original packaging covered with stretch film.
- Other parts can be covered with bubble wrap and packed with flyers or boxes and shipped via multi-piece shipment (MPS)



- For tyres or items of the same nature, please ensure that the tire is deflated before packing.
- Wrap the tyres with **tear-resistant** stretch wrap.
- It is best advised to puncture some holes in the wrap on both sides to make it easier to hold or carry.
- Paste the consignment note (CN) on top of the wrapped tyre.




. Heavy, bulky items that have parts that can be disassembled need to be packed separately.

 Ensure the parts are clean of oil and lubricants. The disassembled parts should be wrapped and packed in separate boxes for multi-piece shipment (MPS)

It is best advised to fill the box with **peanut foam** before packing your items. **Seal** the boxes tightly with "H-taping" method.

Labelling



Marking and labeling are important steps when preparing a package for transportation. Labels often communicate the hazards associated with the package, and allows for better handling accordingly.

Here are some labels that you can use for your shipment.




